Most visits start at the Greenrig Car park. 3 miles from the centre of Falkirk. From the centre of town follow the road signs for Slamannan. The trails can also be accessed from the Falkirk Wheel and Falkirk High station following the John Muir Way.

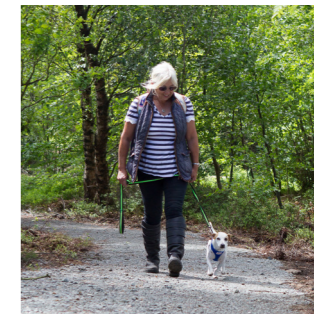

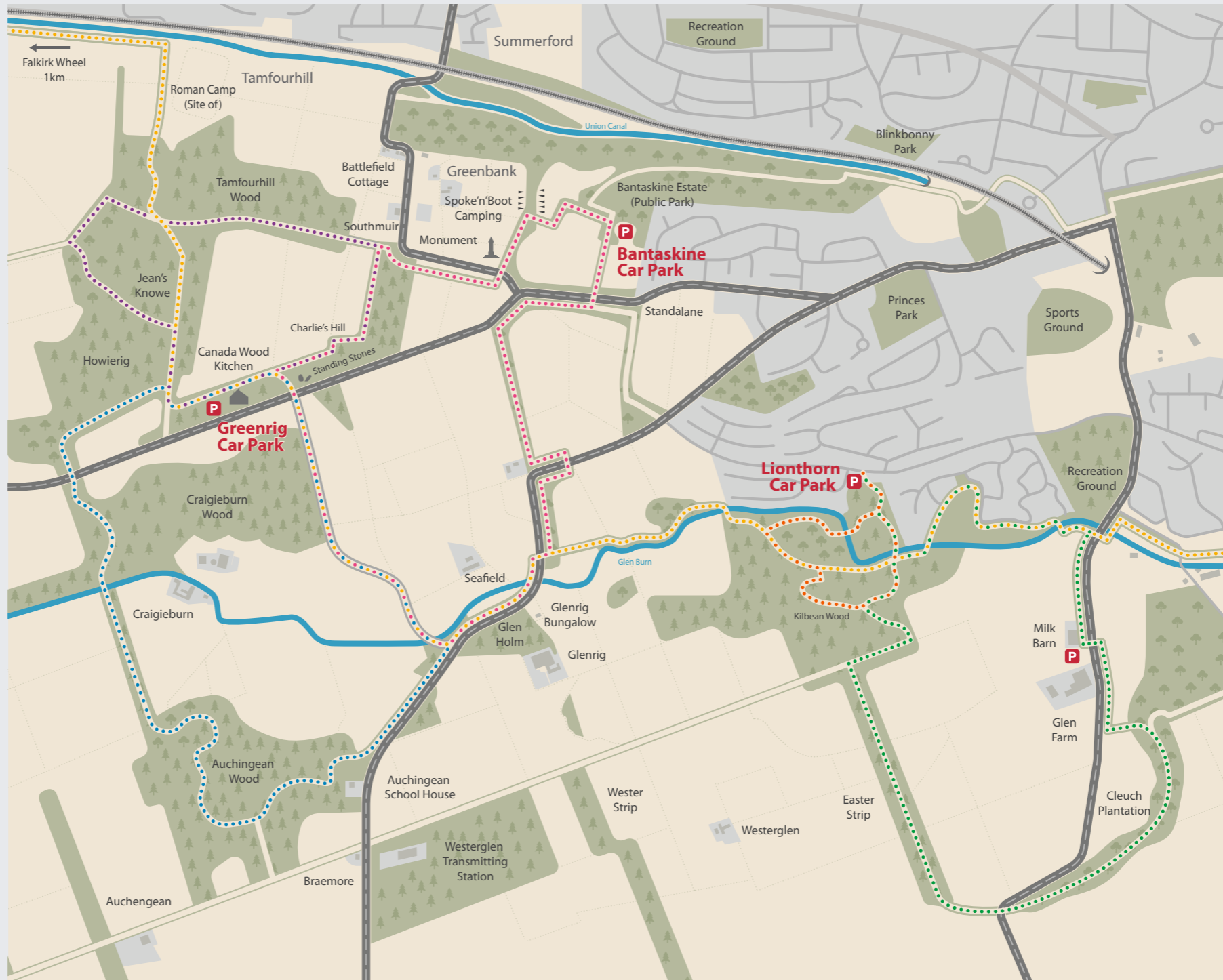
