

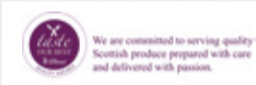

**The Bridgeness Slab**  
An impressive replica of a Roman legionary distance marker stone found in Bo'ness. The original is in the National Museum of Scotland, Edinburgh. Kinnigars Park, Harbour Road, Bo'ness, EH51 9LD.

**Bo'ness Mining Memorial**  
900 years of coal mining history is celebrated in this memorial. Off Seaview Place.

#### KINNEIL

**Kinneil House & Museum**  
A historic mansion, with some of the best Renaissance wall paintings, and surrounded by woodland which includes remains of a Roman fortlet and the Antonine Wall. **James Watt's Cottage**  
The ruins of a cottage where inventor James Watt worked on developing the steam engine. Next to Kinneil House.

**Kinneil Nature Reserve**  
Site of the former Kinneil Colliery, now fully restored and a peaceful place to walk, cycle, go bird watching and appreciate the landscape of the inner Forth. Car parks at Kinneil Road and Snab Lane, Bo'ness, EH51 0PS. By train, alight at Kinneil Halt (Bo'ness and Kinneil Railway).

**Bo'ness Hill Climb**  
This historic motor race (1930s-1960s) was revived in 2008. The 2015 meeting will be held 5th & 6th September (provisional date) in Kinneil Estate. [www.bonesshillclimb.org.uk](http://www.bonesshillclimb.org.uk)

**Callendar House and Park**

**Blackness Castle**

**The Helix and Kelpies**

There's nothing like a departure by steam. Enjoy a scenic ten mile return train journey to Manuel along the Forth Estuary, through woodlands, past waterfalls and over the Avon Viaduct. Our friendly volunteers are waiting to welcome you aboard and invite you to soak up the atmosphere of our award-winning heritage railway through the sights, sounds and smells of yesterday.

Follow our new Visitor Trail to the Museum of Scottish Railways, Scotland's largest railway museum, and see more of what happens around our site at Bo'ness. Explore three large buildings filled with locomotives, carriages, wagons and other railway artefacts. There is plenty to see and do, from climbing on the footplate of a locomotive to sorting letters in the Post Office Sorting coach.

## A great day out - the old fashioned way...

Buy your ticket from the authentic Booking Office, get up close to a mighty steam engine and climb aboard a lovingly restored carriage. Listen for the whistles and watch the green flag as you experience the atmosphere and nostalgia of a bygone era. The Guard will clip your ticket as your journey begins. For on the move refreshments visit our buffet car, then sit back and relax as the train travels through the Scottish countryside.

### All Aboard!

**New platform at Manuel**  
Align at our new platform at Manuel as we move the locomotive from the front to the back of the train for the return journey. Meet the driver on the footplate to get that all-important photograph.

**Back at Bo'ness**  
Visit the Museum of Scottish Railways via our new Visitor Trail which takes in the railway yard and will give you a great insight into what goes on behind the scenes.

**Discover your railway heritage**  
Find out how railways transformed the lives of our ancestors. See Scotland's only Royal Saloon coach, learn why the Fish Van has a sloping floor, come face-to-face with a mechanical horse and much more.
